Perfect Roberta Fudge

Pour over: 12 oz bag of chocolate chips, 12 oz of broken German's Sweet chocolate, 1pint of marshmellow cream, 2 cups chopped walnuts

Beat until all chocolate is melted, pour into buttered pan and let set few hours before cutting. Freezes well.
