FROM THE BACK SEAT "THE GAL'S PAGE"

I fell into a burning ring of fire



Ok, I didn't really fall into a burning ring of fire (Johnny Cash song as most of you know). But, I took a trip to Hawaii and had several ex-

periences about fire so thought I would share this burning time.

Some of my family went to Hawaii last year, it is an annual thing. My sister, she who shall not be named, was meeting me at the Hilton Garden Inn at the Portland area, she comes from Corvallis. I thought I would get there early and check in; when I got there found out the elevator wasn't working. My sister is legally blind and walks with a cane due to hip and back problems. Knew this wouldn't work so went to the Courtyard Marriott down the street. At 2:00 am that morning the fire alarm system went off. We made it safely down the stairs (2nd floor) and back up to our rooms as it was a false alarm. My sister said it was all my fault, I denied that.

When our plane landed in Maui we had to wait about 40 minutes to deboard due to smoke on the runway from a fire close by. Again, was told it was all my fault. It's a sibling thing right?!

Our resort was about 4 miles north of Lahaina. Yes, we were there when the fires broke out in Lahaina. Lost power Tuesday morning at about

2 am. Told to shelter in place and prepare to evacuate. Mind you there are 12 of us in separate rooms of course. 2 little girls 2 and 3 years old, their moms and dads, their grandmas, 2 great uncles and 2 great aunts. Of course, it was difficult to communicate with family in California and Oregon but made some contacts. A niece made reservations for us near the airport for Thursday night. We stayed, walked to the beach to make phone calls, entered the refrigerator only when necessary (to preserve what food we had), and discussed options. The plan was to leave Thursday morning as soon as road opened to the airport, fortunately we had three cars or this would not have happened. The drivers had to find the cars and we loaded up.

We made it safely to the airport motel. Our flights left as planned on Friday morning. Some left earlier in the day. The good news is that we all made it home safely. Driving by Lahaina was hard to see the burnt town. Our troubles were minor compared to what happened in that beautiful town. Driving home from the airport I was in a daze looking at the green and saying yes I am home.

But wait, that is not all about the fire thing. Two days after I was home our power went out in the living room. We hired an electrician, and it took them about an hour of checking to find a burnt plug into an outlet; it was melted but luckily minor damage. So, I called my sister in Corvallis and said "Yes, it was me!"


PS: We are going back to Hawaii this year to Kauai with about 40 family members.


