Last month, I spoke about car maintenance. This month I want to speak of tool loaning/borrowing etiquette.

My own experience, and a passion for tools began in the 60's as a boy using Dad's tools working on my bike. I was scolded a few times for leaving his tools lay where I was using them long after I rode the bike away. Often this was out in the yard somewhere.

I learned to take care of Dads tools and was encouraged to purchase and take care of my own tools. When I was a Junior in High School, I worked at an Industrial Supply shop and many of my paychecks went to purchasing my own tools. This was the beginning of my life long investment of tools and earning myself the classification of a "Tool Monger." I grew up when tools were expensive and labor was cheap.

During my professional career in construction, I saw this change and tools became cheaper and labor became more expensive. In 42 years working in the construction field, I lost two complete sets of personal tools out of the backs of trucks in Portland. Each time it was a major setback to have to go out and buy new and used tools to do my job effectively.

Automotive tools can be very specific to performing a certain task or job, and many folks cannot afford to purchase them. Fortunately, some auto parts stores have loaner programs, and/or we know of someone that has the tool needed to accomplish the job. If you are considering borrowing or loaning a tool, a few rules should be considered:



Respect is the most important. If someone is using automotive tools to earn a living, they are much less likely to loan a tool out. They have already been burned a few times. If they say no, please respect that decision.

If you have loaned/borrowed a tool, take very good care of it. Return it promptly, clean and without damage. If you damage it or loose it, you should be expected to replace it with equal value or a better tool. Don't keep them too long and get them back to the owner quickly.

One of my friends that sometimes borrows tools, writes the owners names on them or tags them to be sure they get back to the rightful owner. I think that's a great idea. I've seen people loaning tools write it down of who has the tool with a brief description, another great idea.

These are just a few of the etiquette items that come to mind . There are many more. I have been one of the violators of these etiquette items. By writing about this, I hope to become better within this subject. Many times, I have been looking for a tool that I know I own but cannot find it. My search goes on and on and I begin to think and even accuse friends of taking them. Almost always much later, I find the tool after an exhaustive and thorough cleaning of my shop. This happened just this last week where I could not find a set of wheel dollies for many weeks. I finally found them after the 4th cleaning of my shop.

The lesson here is to myself and anyone else that may benefit from it is, "go clean your shop, garage or tool box" You will find tools and other items that have been missing for some time, or possibly belong to someone else.

Again, I hope to see all of you at the 50's Cruise May 25th at Camp Rilea.




