#### More Than a Sunday Drive

Several years ago, Jeff and I took a quick trip to Missoula, Montana to attend a friend's memorial. We stayed to visit friends and family then left for home.

We enjoyed the splendor of October when the scenery was a blaze of color. Heading back through Idaho, we decided to make a stop in the town of Wallace, just off Interstate 90. Maybe some of you know this town.

Wallace, Idaho is a unique community, one of a kind you might say. It sits tucked in the Bitterroot Mountains. We took our time browsing the quaint streets, learning why part of it sits underneath Interstate 90. Yes, underneath!

From what I read about the town, and I quote, "the government tried to pave over the town for the new interstate highway back in 1967." The community tied up the case in court for seventeen years. During that time the residents of Wallace added most of the buildings in the downtown area to the National Register of Historic Places. Theus, the town was never paved over. However, I-90 zooms with traffic overhead.

Jeff and I strolled the main streets appreciating the historic buildings, some dating back to the 19th century. We stopped to admire and wonder about the stately manhole cover at the intersection of 6th and Bank Street, where the Mayor of Wallace declared that very spot was the center of the universe, that was back in 2004. Following the premise that something is true if it can't be proven otherwise.

We were too tired to climb the Historic Wallace Stairs that are built into the hillside. Constructed around 1909, all together consisting of 800 steps.

Main Street offered several places to eat and relax like The Red Light Garage restaurant/ antique store. Also, The Tin Snug sounded interesting. It featured mouth watering sandwiches and delicious ice cream. To wet our whistle there was the Wallace Brewing Company. And the fainting Goat, a self-service wine establishment.

We were told of an activity that perfectly embodies Wallace, that was a tour of the Oasis Bordello Museum. I remember telling Jeff we didn't have time for that. Another feature that brought fame to Wallace was the movie Dante's Peak, which was filmed there back in 1997.

Wallace was a boomtown in its heyday, with miners striking it rich in silver and timber barons logging off the surrounding hills. Now days Wallace is still a little quirky, but it sits peacefully in Idaho's beautiful panhandle. I'm sure there is more to see and do in Wallace. Maybe there's more to learn about this town's colorful past. But that's for another trip.


