So you think this is a Mustang?? You would be wrong.

This is a T5. What is a T5 you ask, T5 is German for Mustang - That is a complicated story so let's start at the beginning.

I first met Grandma Cindy in 2009 while working at Columbia Vet Hospital in Astoria, Oregon. She and her husband, Gregg Hilton, had no relatives and my daughter, Stasia, and I were alone as well. We became good friends and we adopted each other as family. They became our adopted Grandma Cindy and Papa Gregg. Both are gone now and very much missed. They lived just over the bridge in Cathlamet, Washington. The first time Stasia and I went to their home I was taken a bit back as their yard had a few decrepit old vehicles as well as boats in it. Suffice it to say I almost didn't see the little Mustang in the carport. We didn't really start spending much time over at their house until after Papa Gregg died of Multiple Myeloma in 2010. It was then that I took on helping Cindy with the house. We began by selling off the boats and were able to move the 1973 Thing off the side of the road into her 3rd bay. The sad little blue car had been covered and buried by stuff for at least 8 years based on the date of its license plate tags. I was instantly in love even though it was in terrible shape.

I also, fell in love with the Thing – but the Thing meant more to Cindy because of the ties to her late husband. I did try to get the Thing running, but the Air Cooled VW engine was a horse of a different color.

We were able to get 2 late model Astro Van's, a 1973 Ford F150 (aka Plumb Truck), a late model Thunderbird with a bashed in back end all running, but the little blue car and Thing were more than stubborn. Cindy was able to drive most of the cars until it became just too much to keep them insured and running. We slowly sold off most of the vehicles and were left with Plumb Truck, the Mustang, and the Thing. I opted at this time to sell Cindy my little Prius as she really needed a reliable car. Plumb truck went to a new home when it just became too much to keep it running safe.

After we cleared out the upper yard we then turned to getting the house de-cluttered. Both Cindy and Gregg were avid collectors of a variety of "Collectable" objects. Anything from Hot Wheels to Blue flow China. She had 2 stories and over 30 years of accumulated stuff. It was very difficult for her to move around the house at that the time. Stasia and I spent many weekends over there helping to get things cleaned up. I finally had the courage to ask if I could try to get the little Blue Mustang to run and Cindy thought that would be a great idea and would have made Papa Gregg proud to see it run again. That was also the time I learned that it really wasn't a Mustang, but a T5. Cindy drug out a manila file of magazine articles and so began my love affair with the little T5.

I really didn't know that much about cars at that time – not that I know a lot now, but I knew enough on how to change the oil, the alternator and water pump from my high school cars. My first lesson was if it doesn't run it's either not getting spark or fuel. Easy right?? NOT!!! Enter the carburetor. My Nemesis!!

I began by doing what I knew. Do a full tune up including oil, spark plugs, plugs wires etc... It was more than glorious the day she finally started but then sadly had no power to move. I slowly began to learn a little about carburation. The original carburetor had been a bed for a lovely family of rodents whose urine destroyed it. I mean really, it was a single barrel and only had 3 screws to adjust, how hard could it be? I think I finally bought 5 carburetors before I had one that mostly worked...most of the time...until the weather changed...then changed back...still my Nemesis!

With her mostly running I got the courage up to ask Cindy if I could buy it. By this time, in the house, we had gotten most everything cleaned up and realized how awful her bathrooms were. We were able to lay new Luxury Vinyl after removing the 70's carpet and decided to tackle the bathrooms. Unfortunately, money was an issue and I then had a brilliant idea and my chance. I offered to buy the little T5 and in exchange we would use the money to remodel her bathrooms. The deal was struck!!

Much to my neighbors dismay we showed up one day with that sad little car on a U-Haul trailer and barely made it into my garage amid much black smoke and backfires. That was early 2018.

She was finally at my home and I could work on her at my leisure after work. I, unfortunately, had to hire someone to get the carburetor tuned as that mystical creation still eluded me.

That was a very educational spring and summer. My goal was to get her to our first Rod Run that fall. 2018 was a year full of trial and errors and just the beginning or our journey!
